An Expert Sample Versus an Undergraduate Sample with an Educational Lecture Manipulation

The current dissertation research project examined the attitudes and beliefs toward forensic hypnosis across three different samples-an expert sample, an undergraduate sample with a educational lecture manipulation, and an undergraduate control sample. Forensic hypnosis is often used within the legal system in conjunction with criminal investigations. Such uses include refreshing the memory of traumatized victims, refreshing the memory of witnesses in order to produce investigative leads, or refreshing the memory of defendants claiming amnesia for the crime. Due to the controversial nature of hypnotic techniques, forensic hypnosis holds a contentious and oft debated position within the legal system. This study served to examine the attitudes of hypnosis experts in the field as compared to a relatively uninformed sample (an undergraduate sample). For the expert sample, a mass mailing was implemented to members of a leading professional hypnosis society while undergraduate students at the University of Louisville were sampled to serve as a comparison sample.
